High School Basketball Pregame

- 1. New Rule and Mechanic Changes
- 2. Game Protocol
 - a. Meet with the captains/coaches 12:00
 - b. Meet with table crew Everyone go over (Sign Book)
 - c. National Anthem/Introductions
- 3. Primary/Secondary Areas of Responsibility
 - a. On-Ball Coverage
 - b. Off-Ball Coverage
 - c. Strongside Half-Court Coverage
 - d. Set the tone/tempo
 - e. Match-ups (Problem areas and/or players)
 - f. RSBQ Rhythm/Speed/Balance/Quickness
- 4. Transitions
 - a. Basic Court Transition/Pressure
 - b. Fast Break (Lead take pass; T or C take the crash)
 - c. One-on-one Situations
 - d. Press Coverage (C stay home)
 - e. Backcourt pressure
- 5. Shot/Rebound Coverage (Strong Game from T and C)
- 6. Violations (Bump and Run backcourt)
- 7. Throw-ins/OB Coverage (Get the spot right/Call your own lines)
- 8. Personal/Technical Fouls (Table side reporting)
- 9. Player Disqualification (Calling Official Handle)
- 10. Free Throws (Be aware of Bonus/Help with Shooter)
- 11. 3-Point Shots (Protect the Shooter) (Watch areas of intersection)
- 12. Subs/Timeout Administration (Transfer of subs when necessary)
- 13. Clock/Dead Ball Management
- 14. Last Second Shot (Make sure of proper responsibility)

- 15. Timing Counts/Signals (10 seconds, closely guarded, etcetera)
- 16. Rotations/Switches
- 17. Post Play (Watch displacement)
- 18. Hand Checking
- 19. Verticality (Don't penalize height or jumping ability)
- 20. Patient Whistle (Especially on blocked shots and rebound situations)
- 21. Call the Obvious Fouls/Violations
- 22. ANTICIPATE THE PLAY NOT THE CALL
- 23. Review shot clock principles.
 - a. When it resets
 - b. When it doesn't
 - c. Beware of actual time on both clocks when whistles blows
- 24. New frontcourt inbound spots (When, Why & Where)

Basketball Pregame Guidance

Communication:

- 1. Partners/Players/Coaches/Table
 - a. Listen prior to responding
- 2. Professional
 - a. Dignity and respect
 - b. Partner Call, Partner Respond
- 3. Body language versus word choices
- 4. Use your voice regularly
 - a. Players/Partners

Coverage:

- 1. Owning primaries
- 2. Trusting partners vs. Crew savers
- 3. Accepting Plays- Shoulders
- 4. Adjust to officiate matchups
- 5. Double Whistles (Intersections)
 - a. Blow and Hold
- 6. Dead ball officiating
 - a. Remain engaged
 - b. Walk teams to huddles

Consistent:

- 1. Ready from the start
- 2. Allow plays to start, develop, finish

- 3. Anticipate plays, Not calls
- 4. 10-1-4
- 5. Similar plays, similar calls
- 6. Incidental versus Illegal (Officiate the defense)
 - a. Don't penalize legal defense
 - b. Don't reward offensive initiated contact
- 7. Remain engaged
- 8. Bench decorum

Presentation:

- 1. Whistles
- 2. Hustle
- 3. Effort
- 4. Attitude
- 5. Calming presence
- 6. Mechanics
- 7. CONFIDENTALLY IN CONTROL

Additional items for less experienced officials

- 1. Court diagrams
- 2. Free throw coverages
- 3. Press coverage
- 4. Illegal vs. Incidental
- 5. Responsibilities on fouls/violations
 - a. Calling vs non-calling officials

Gatto Basketball Pregame

- 1. Notice player tendencies during warmups.
- 2. Eye contact and count players before throw in.
- 3. Communicate: With each other, players and coaches
- 4. Identify key players
- 5. Stay in primary area. 60-40 court coverage Don't ball watch. Trust partners.
- 6. Rebounding fouls: No cheap fouls on bigs.
- 7. Verticality: Recognize retreating defenders who are legal.
- 8. Free throw: Same side/opposite side, know who you're watching
- 9. Trail and center don't bail out on shot, stay to get pushing and on the back fouls.
- 10. Hold and eye contact on double whistle. Primary take to bench.
- 11. Block/Charge: Know the primary and when to hold.
- 12. Rotate with purpose. Lead- rotate to get the ball-side post matchup. (C-initiates at times)

- 13. Non-calling officials watch players. Get shooter when 1-1.
- 14. Get the first foul. Be consistent.
- 15. Officiate defense. Legal guarding position can move laterally and backwards.
- 16. Fouls: RSBQ (Rhythm, Speed, Balance, Quickness) 2 hands, hot stove, arm bar
- 17. Off ball coverage RSBQ
- 18. Watch Dead Ball "Dummy"
- 19. Trail and Center officiate from feet up. Get the traveling violations.
- 20. Timeouts: Make sure there is player control.
- 21. Get the call right (backcourt, out of bounds, 3 pointer etc) get together if we need to, possibly overturn/overrule partner with definite knowledge.
- 22. Goaltending/Basket interference discussion

Points of Emphasis:

- 1. Announcer Duties
- 2. Correctable Errors: Get together if there is an issue.
- 3. Front Court/Back Court Ball Status
- 4. Team Control on Throw Ins. No free throws shot on offensive fouls.

Areas:

- 1. 60/40 Center/Trail
- 2. Trust your partners!
- 3. Work to get good angles.
- 4. Any block/charge call goes to ball side Lead first.
- 5. Lead get ball side! Keep moving! Look for the match-up.
- 6. Trail get low when ball is in the paint. 28' line to top of key...
- 7. Across from bench has last shot.
- 8. Primary area has ball all the way to the basket on a drive. (discuss block charge when coming from center/trail position)

Lead:

- 1. Sprint to get out front on break.
- 2. Responsible for end line.
- 3. Responsible for half of lane up to free throw line down to 3 pt line.
- 4. Get ball side! Get the post match up.
- 5. Close down on drives in paint. Lead/Center
- 6. Take the first block/charge call if ball side. Otherwise Center gets the first call.
- 7. Stay away from goal tending or basket interference call.

Center:

1. Help trail with press. Starting at 28' line in backcourt. Look for 2nd match-up.

- 2. Responsible for sideline.
- 3. Officiate from feet up. Get the travels.
- 4. Position a step or 2 above or below free throw line
- 5. Watch off ball when ball is away. Illegal screens.
- 6. Responsible for goal tending/basket interference.
- 7. Responsible for call on ball over backboard and hitting standard. (including ft's)
- 8. Primary call for on-the-back.
- 9. Signals 3 point attempt or mirrors counted goal from Center.
- 10. Close down on shot or drive
- 11. Free throw coverage: discuss/draw up

Trail:

- 1. Follow ball up court staying back 3-5 feet.
- 2. Don't get in front of ball.
- 3. Mirrors the Lead on end line throw in.
- 4. Stay as high as ball in front court.
- 5. Close down when ball in the post or on shot/drive.
- 6. Watch off-ball when ball is away. Illegal screens.
- 7. Responsible for goal tending/basket interference.
- 8. Responsible for call on ball over backboard and hitting standard. (including ft's)
- 9. Primary call for on-the-back.

Fouls:

- 1. Get the first foul!
- 2. Be consistent on both ends of the court. Hand checking is a foul on both ends. Communicate and pay attention as to what your partners are calling.
- 3. Non-calling officials, get the shooter, Come in and communicate right away.
- 4. Eye contact on double whistles. Primary coverage takes call.
- 5. Follow shooter to the floor.
- 6. Don't bail out and offensive player out of control. Including fade away shots!
- 7. Point to Spot: Calling official on foul or violation, point to spot where ball will be taken out of bounds.
- 8. Intentional fouls: 2 shots and ball at POI. Any play not on ball is INTENTIONAL.
- 9. Discuss screening
- 10. On the back is a foul, over the back is not. Don't penalize players for being taller than everyone else.

Technical Foul:

- 1. Communicate any warnings to a player or coach.
- 2. Enforce bench decorum.
- 3. Don't be quick to pull trigger.

4. Technical on coach or bench; report, and move away to Center. Center will work with the bench and coaches.

Talking with Coaches:

- 1. 3 B's (Be Brief, Be Bright, Be Gone)
- 2. Know the rules, use the rules when answering questions.
